Report to Members from the Board of Management

Chairman, Board of Management

It is my pleasure to tender this report on the activities of the Club for Season 2009/2010.

In my opinion Shepparton Park Bowls Club has experienced another outstanding season.

We have delivered excellent performances on the greens with our Ladies Section doing very well with premierships in Division 1 and Division 4 and final appearances in Division 2.

The Division 1 Ladies went on to win the Group Final and just missed out on the first day of the State Finals at Echuca.

In the Men's Section we won a back to back premiership in Division 3 and Division 1 & 2 played off in the finals. Overall these were very solid results and leave us with the expectation of further success in the seasons ahead.

Congratulations to our selectors for their efforts in putting teams together each week and achieving the results as above. Theirs is a difficult job with very little recognition for their work.

Congratulations to our Club Champions this season. Di Hands for the Ladies and Brad Clarke in the Men's. They were worthy Champions, and thank you to all the other members who competed in our Club Events.

Our Thursday feature of 2x2 pairs was again an outstanding success with bowlers attending from many of our surrounding clubs. Thank you to Geoff Boyle and David Slingo for conducting such a successful format.

A new innovation this season was the 40/40 Bowls introduced under the guidance of Ron Holland. This format proved to be popular with many of our New Members and allowed them to experience bowls at a very informal level. Thank you Ron and all those who helped.

Our night pennant was again successful and fills a very important roll in assimilating new members into the bowling fraternity. Thank you to Bill Clark and Jim Broadbent who were the organisers of this event.

We again ran a full calendar of feature tournaments. These events take a lot of work to put together and special thanks to our Tournament Committee Wally Bramley, Betty Bicknell and Margo Dobson.

To enable all the above bowling activity to run smoothly it requires efficient Sectional personnel and this season we have had outstanding leaders in Pam McGurgan and Laurie Fagan. Many thanks for your work and also thanks to your Secretaries and sectional officials.

In the past Season we engaged Geoff Sutcliffe as our Club Coach for a one season appointment. Many Members took advantage of Geoff's coaching skills to improve and refine their game.

The Board decided in March not to appoint a Coach for the following season, we wished to assess the future requirements of the Club when it is operating ht under cover green. Considerations on this subject are still going on at this time.

I wish to thank Geoff for his work and time he spent at Shepparton Park and wish him well for the future.

Our Indoor Bowls Section enjoyed another very successful season. This section keeps our Members busy in the off Season and gives a lot of pleasure to those who play indoors. Many thanks to President Fred Murley and his team of helpers on a job well done.

Our Bowling greens playing surfaces improved dramatically this season with the Members Green finally reaching its full potential. Many thanks to Greens Director Noel Dobson and his band of willing workers. With special recognition to Frank Winter, Graeme Cross and Ray Phillips. This Group have constantly prepared greens of the highest standards for us. Thank you again.

Our Club has enjoyed many pleasant social events throughout the season including our famous Chicken and Salad nights, Jazz on the greens and the welcoming event to the Australian Open and our Friday night happy hour. Many thanks to Chairman Ken Allen and his band of workers - a job really well done.

The Bar was again supervised by Glen Edwards, who put in a great deal of work and time to make this important part of our Club activities work efficiently. Thank you Glen and your assistants for an excellent job and for the magnificent contribution the Bar has made to our finances.

Sponsorship has become a very important part of the finances of our Club and this year Chairman Alan Sutherland delivered outstanding results with a total of \$15,000.00 raised in Sponsorship. We must recognise and thank all our generous sponsors and support their various businesses when ever we have an opportunity to do so.

Our Ladies in the Kitchen did us proud through the season providing members and guests with first class catering. A special thank you to retiring Chairperson Flo Holland for her outstanding contribution not only for this season but the many past seasons. And thank you to the Ladies who assisted in any way in the kitchen.

Our Clubhouse has been improved by the installation of acoustic panels on the eastern wall, however; more work needs to be done in this area and I recommend to the new Board that it continues to seek ways to improve the acoustic levels of the Building.

I would like to acknowledge the work done by Bob Smith in attending to the many and varied jobs in maintaining the Club House. I am sure many Members are unaware of the time Bob puts in to make all this happen. Thank you Bob for a job well done.

Our Club's finances are in excellent shape after all sections of the Club have made significant contributions. In particular the Bar has traded very well and the Open returned an outstanding profit of some \$37,000.00.

This leaves us with funds available to fit out the new Under Cover Green, commence construction of the fourth green and be able to recommend to you that we maintain next seasons subscriptions and green fees at their present level.

Undoubtedly the highlight of the season was the staging of the Australian Open 2010.

We were blessed with favourable weather leading up to and during the event and we had learned quite a bit from the conduct of the previous year's Open and as a result I believe it was an even better presentation than 2009.

Our members really got behind the event and supplied a high level of involvement, filling the many and varied tasks that they were called upon during the week.

The participation of the English Commonwealth Games Team gave another dimension to the event and it was great to see the way they joined in and enjoyed our Club's hospitality.

They were rewarded with some excellent results on the green.

Our Club Members did us proud in the Australian Open with Di Hands, Donna Clarke and Brett Foley winning their way through several rounds and our Team of Bev Thorn, Bev Cahill and Shirley Raglus finishing runner up in the over 60 triples.

I would like to thank our co-hosts of the Open, Mooroopna Bowls Club and the Greater Shepparton City Council.

It was a real pleasure to work with these people and I hope we can take this spirit of co-operation into the future and we can develop a Premier Bowls Carnival staged in the Goulburn Valley.

The Open will now return to Darebin Bowling Centre but we will always treasure the memories of the 2009/2010 Australian Opens.

It is with a great deal of pleasure that I can report to you that Stage 2 of the development of the Shepparton Park Bowling Club is now under way.

The Council accepted a tender to construct an under cover green and additions to our Club House at an estimated cost of \$2.3m.

The projected completion date is October, 2010 and we can look forward with a great deal of excitement to the opening of this wonderful facility.

I would like to acknowledge the work of our Stage 2 Sub Committees – Bob Smith, Noel Dobson and Steve Mitchell and from last year Jim Shanahan.

Their efforts will soon be rewarded by this outstanding development.

Finally I would like to thank the Board of Management Members for their support and contributions throughout the season.

We have had to deal with a wide range of issues, all of which received their earnest consideration.

A special thank you to the Board Secretary, Steve Mitchell who came in on short notice and carried out his tasks with style, and to our co-treasurers Glenice Mawson and Leigh Pomeroy for their major contributions in collecting and accounting for the Clubs funds.

I thank you one and all for your support throughout the season and wish you a happy and healthy winter break.

I look forwards to bowling with you next season.

Bar Director

With the end of the season comes the usual reflection of the year in general and how we can improve our service and trade, not only to our members, but guests of the Club, be it other bowlers or the general public. This year's Australian Open proved that we can cater for large events with both food and liquor and should not hesitate in actively pursuing similar events in the future.

To the bar staff who helped out over the year, I thank you very much, without your input the bar couldn't function anywhere near as smoothly, or profitably, as it has over the past four years.

To those members (and others) who complain about our Bar prices and happily compare them to other Clubs (some other Clubs), just do a full comparison. Shepparton Park ~ 3 greens, big beautiful Clubhouse with great facilities, ongoing extensions and improvements but with fairly high overheads (gas, water, electricity, greens maintenance etc.) other Clubs with cheaper drinks ~ Two greens (some with only one green) small, older Clubhouse with less facilities and low overhead running costs. Yes our prices are slightly dearer than SOME other Clubs, but a lot cheaper than Pubs and Restaurant's. If you want these great facilities, some how you have to pay for them, and I don't think an extra 50cents is too expensive.

I would say our prices are correct, and it is their prices that are too low, it is time they lost their "Crackerjack" mentality of super low beer prices at bowls Clubs and joined the 21st century.

If you are still unhappy, but have a plan or idea as to how we can raise the necessary money to cover these high overhead costs; preferably from people outside the Club (such as Mooroopna's Bingo nights) and one that YOU would be willing to participate in; then I'm sure the Board will give approval to drop the prices, until this happens, the prices remain as is.

We have had two bouts of wind damage to our shade structures this past year and insurance has been able to cover the damage. The shelters will be removed for the covered green building operations and be re-erected at the end of the construction period.

The Australian Open again proved how good our facilities are at handling large crowds of players & spectators. Bringing everyone through the front entrance worked well and gave visitors every opportunity to appreciate our Bar & Food Service functions.

Next year will see a great demand on our financial resources as we contemplate furnishing the new covered green, with its outdoor bar, canteen and alfresco style viewing deck. I would also like to see us with a meeting -cum- board table in the lounge and some permanent seating near the BBQ area.

However I believe that this committee has done an excellent job in finding 92 bowlers for each of 18 rounds and for keeping teams stable, particularly in the higher divisions.

The **Match Committee** has again worked hard under the leadership of Leigh Pomeroy as Chairman to provide the number of different events that we have come to enjoy. Each one of us who participates in these events can help immensely by ensuring that matches are played on or before the due date.

The **2x2 pairs** held on Thursdays continues to be very successful as evidenced by the number of visiting bowlers it attracts each week. The introduction of drawn partners once a month has also been well

received. Well done David Slings and Jeff Boyle for a great job. Again, it is important to appreciate that this weekly event doesn't just happen and that it requires at least a couple of hours preparation each week. Those who play 60 and over certainly enjoy their weekly bowls in an atmosphere which is a little more social than pennant, for example. Night Pennant again consisted of 20 teams and pre-Christmas had to be played over 2 nights, an organizational nightmare met full-on by Bill and Jim in a professional manner. Congratulations to Sea Eagles in coming from seventh position to win the flag and to Pykies Clan for being Runners Up. Thanks Bill and Jim for a great effort.

The **Trade and Social** nights currently being held under the new Forty 40 format and co-ordinated by our hard-working Secretary Ron are proving to be very popular. Ron, through his alertness and initiative was able to obtain a grant to purchase 10 sets of new bowls that can be used for occasions like this when we are introducing prospective bowlers to the sport.
